The season of Advent is upon us. It's a season of the church year in which we prepare for the coming of the Christ child. This year the theme of our reading and preaching will be "Life." Hopefully, it will serve as a reminder to us all that God wants us to experience LIFE. We live in a world filled with so much death and destruction, yet we know this is not what God wants for us. So, this Advent we are going to explore the kind of life that God wants for us.

We kick off the season exploring "Faithful Life" as we hear the great story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. It's a fantastic Old Testament story where three men refuse to bow down and worship the statue made by the king...even under threat of being thrown into a fiery furnace. Where is your faith being challenged these days? How might God be calling you to remain faithful in the midst of the world's threats to your faith?

Our second week we will look at a "Restored Life" as we read from Ezekiel and hear about the Valley of Dry Bones coming back to life. Do you ever feel tired and worn out by life? Have you ever felt like you have put in your time and now it is somebody else's turn to pitch in? How might God be working to restore you to life? How might God still want to use you for the sake of God's Kingdom?

"Abundant Life" is our theme for week three. I sometimes have a tendency to approach life like the lazy river at a water park, just sort of floating along. Sometimes, that is exactly what we need. However, I believe God wants more for us than to just get along, taking in whatever life has to dish out. I believe God wants us to embrace life and to experience the abundance life has for us to experience.

By our fourth week of Advent we will be experiencing the darkest time of the year and we will be reminded that God has come to bring "Light & Life" to the world. Ever notice how light always chases away the darkness? In fact, it doesn't take a whole lot of light to be able to push away the darkness. How might you allow that light to shine through you to bring life into the world?

Finally, on Christmas Eve, we will be reminded that we can experience all of these forms of life because of the "Life Born for You!" So, come and join us this Advent as we explore what it means to experience the kind of "Life" God wants for each and every one of us!
